Youth Leadership Program

House Farm Workers! meets monthly with the youth at One Step a la Vez in Fillmore. During these meetings, our Executive Director engages the already-advocating youth with an educational activity or community guest speaker to provide them with information about affordable farm worker housing. Topics include the process of developing housing, and how to advocate for it in their community.

CSUCI Collaborative Immersion Project

House Farm Workers! and the CSU Channel Islands (CSUCI) Center for Community Engagement have partnered with Reiter Affiliated Companies and Cabrillo Economic Development Corp. to provide an immersion opportunity for CSUCI students focused on the farm worker experience, agriculture, and farm worker housing. 40

Community Events

House Farm Workers! booths at community events allow for the distribution of materials, such as our farmworker housing resource sheet. Booths are an opportunity to talk with the grower, farmworker, and housing communities. Our staff is available at booths to speak with farmworkers about affordable housing and how to apply for it.

Community Members **House Farm Workers!** has established committees that cover the unincorporated county, Santa Paula, Fillmore, Ventura, Oxnard, Camarillo and Moorpark. These volunteerdriven committees are the heart of the organization and have played a critical role in advocating on behalf of the farm worker community since 2004. The city groups mobilize public support, engage public officials, and collaborate with other grassroots organizations to ensure affordable housing for farm workers.

Affordable Housing Task Force Groups

The Santa Paula Affordable Housing Task Force (SPAHTF) is a diverse group of Santa Paula residents and affordable housing experts from throughout Ventura County. The task force works closely with the Santa Paula City Planners, to give effective input to the General Plan, Housing Element updates, and advocate for revisions to zoning codes and other housing policies, regulations, and fees.

The Fillmore and Piru Task Force (FPTF) was formed in 2022 by House Farm Workers! to address the Fillmore Housing Element 2021-2029 Update.

Ventura County Farmworker Housing Study and Action Plan

House Farm Workers! in partnership with the County of Ventura, began a Countywide Farmworker Housing Study and Action Plan in Fall 2021, to identify housing needs of farmworkers in the County and consider alternate solutions to improve and develop much-needed farmworker housing throughout the County. The Study and Action Plan will be utilized by the incorporated cities and the county to develop targeted programs and strategies to address the identified housing needs of farmworkers, and to support agricultural businesses with a stable and healthy workforce.

This project is coordinated and funded by the County of Ventura, all ten cities within the county and the Thelma Hansen Fund and the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC).

Ellen Brokaw Scholarship

The Ellen Brokaw *House Farm Workers!* Scholarship is awarded each year to college-bound or current college students whose parents are farm workers in Ventura County. This scholarship reflects our commitment to making sure our farm worker families can thrive.

The scholarship is named in honor of Ellen Brokaw, founding chairwoman of *House Farm Workers!*
