City Committees

House Farm Workers! has established committees in Ventura, and Oxnard. These volunteer-driven committees are the heart of the organization and have played a critical role in advocating on behalf of the farm worker community since 2004. The city groups mobilize public support, engage public officials, and collaborate with other grassroots organizations to ensure affordable housing for farm workers.

Affordable Housing Task Force Groups

The Santa Paula Affordable Housing Task Force (SPAHTF) is a diverse group of Santa Paula residents and affordable housing experts from throughout Ventura County. The task force works closely with the Santa Paula City Planners, to give effective input to the General Plan, Housing Element updates, and advocate for revisions to zoning codes and other housing policies, regulations, and fees.

The Fillmore and Piru Task Force (FPTF) was formed in 2022 by *House Farm Workers!* to address the Fillmore Housing Element 2021-2029 Update.

Ventura County Farmworker Housing Study and Action Plan

Phase 3 Results and Phase 4 Kickoff

House Farm Workers!, in partnership with the County of Ventura, began a Countywide Farm Worker Housing Study and Action Plan in Fall 2021, to identify housing needs of farmworkers in the County and consider alternate solutions to improve and develop much-needed farm worker housing throughout the County. A survey of 417 farm workers was completed, and consulting firm BAE Urban Economics created the Ventura County Farmworker Study – Phase 2 and 3 Survey Summary Report, along with a presentation summarizing the results, which was widely shared in 2024 and 2025. Phase 4 community engagement began this year and will continue into next year.

This project is coordinated and funded by the Southern California Association of Governments, the County of Ventura, all ten cities within the county, the Thelma Hansen Fund, and the Ventura County Transportation Commission (VCTC).

Ellen Brokaw Scholarship

The Ellen Brokaw *House Farm Workers!* Scholarship is awarded each year to college-bound or current college students whose parents are farm workers in Ventura County. This scholarship reflects our commitment to making sure our farm worker families can thrive.

The scholarship is named in honor of Ellen Brokaw, founding chairwoman of *House Farm Workers!*
